

Activity Eligibility Requirement

(as defined by the State of Iowa)

This Policy is for students in grades 9-12

I have read the Activity Eligibility policy (see back of this page) as defined by the State of Iowa and I understand that if I receive a failing grade in any of my classes (college level courses included) at the end of the semester, I will be ineligible to participate in any games or competitions for 30 consecutive calendar days. If the season ends before the 30 days is served, the remainder carries over into the next sport and activity I participate in.

Example: A student fails math in the first semester and she is out for basketball. As soon as semester grades are posted, she can no longer dress for basketball games for 30 consecutive calendar days. The basketball season ends 20 days later, leaving the student with 10 days of ineligibility. Those 10 remaining days must be served in the student's next sport, which would be track if she goes out for track, or the next school year in volleyball if she does not go out for track.

School Good Conduct Policy

This policy is for students in grades 7-12

I have read and understand West Lyon school's Good Conduct policy as stated in the student handbook.

I understand that it is a violation of the Good Conduct policy to be:

1. Using or possession of any form of tobacco, nicotine, alcoholic beverages, drugs (see WL's definition of "drugs" stated in the student handbook), or look-a-like substances of such products, including (but not limited to) e-cigarettes.
2. Convicted of a serious misdemeanor or felony crime

Being in violation of the Good Conduct policy will result in being ineligible to participate in a sport for a period of time as defined by the Good Conduct policy.

This notice must be signed by the student athlete and his/her parents and returned to the coach within one week of the start of the season, due _____

After this deadline, the student athlete is not able to practice until this notice is returned to the coach with the requested signatures.

Eligibility Rules

36.15(2) Scholarship rules.

- a. All contestants must be enrolled and in good standing in a school that is a member or associate member in good standing of the organization sponsoring the event.
- b. All contestants must be under 20 years of age.
- c. All contestants shall be enrolled students of the school in good standing. They shall receive credit in at least four subjects, each of one period or "hour" or the equivalent thereof, at all time. To qualify under this rule, a "subject" must meet the requirements of 281–Chapter 12. Coursework taken from a postsecondary institution and for which a school district or accredited nonpublic school grants academic credit toward high school graduation shall be used in determining eligibility. No student shall be denied eligibility if the student's school program deviates from the traditional two–semester school year.

(1) Each contestant shall be passing all coursework for which credit is given and shall be making adequate progress toward graduation requirements at the end of each grading period. Grading period, graduation requirements, and any interim periods of ineligibility are determined by local policy. For purposes of this subrule, "grading period" shall mean the period of time at the end of which a student in grades 9 through 12 receives a final grade and course credit is awarded for passing grades.

(2) If at the end of any grading period a contestant is given a failing grade in any course for which credit is awarded, the contestant is ineligible to dress for and compete in the next occurring interscholastic contests and competitions **for 30 consecutive calendar days.**

d. A student with a disability who has an individualized education program shall not be denied eligibility on the basis of scholarship if the student is making adequate progress, as determined by school officials, towards the goals and objectives on the student's individualized education program.
